Dear Parents and Carers,

Happy New Year and Welcome Back!

I hope this letter finds you well and that you all enjoyed a restful and enjoyable holiday period. On behalf of all the staff at Heathcote I would like to wish our families a very Happy New Year.

We are delighted to see how positively our pupils have returned to school. They have started the term with great enthusiasm and focus on their learning, which has been truly inspiring. Their dedication and determination are a credit to them and to the support you provide at home.

To celebrate our pupils' hard work and achievements, we have already had some fantastic events to kick off the new year. Our 100% Club Celebrations recognised those pupils with outstanding attendance, and the Headteacher's Pizza Lunch provided an enjoyable reward for pupils who have excelled. Both events were wonderful opportunities to celebrate our school community and set a positive tone for the term ahead.



Exciting Curriculum Developments, Staffing Updates, and Homework Changes

I am writing to share some important updates regarding the curriculum, staffing, and homework.

Curriculum Changes in the Creative Arts

After an 18-month search, we are thrilled to welcome Ms Nelson as our new Head of Creative Arts. This appointment allows us to restore two hours of Music and two hours of Drama each week for all pupils. These changes reflect our ongoing commitment to providing a rich and balanced curriculum, ensuring the creative arts remain a vibrant part of our pupils' education.

While we are aware that some pupils may feel disappointed by the reduction in Dance, we are committed to reviewing its provision as we plan for the next academic year. We recognise the value of Dance in fostering both physical and creative expression and will explore options to reintegrate it into the curriculum from September.

Staffing Updates

We are pleased to welcome back Ms Hawkins following her maternity leave, and we know her return will be warmly received by pupils and staff alike.

At the same time, we bid farewell to Mr Monksfield and thank him for his dedication and service to the school. We are currently in the process of recruiting a new Teacher of the Deaf. In the interim, provision for pupils will remain unaffected due to internal timetable changes. Ms Russell and Ms Byrne, who were second in charge of the department, will now lead it on an interim basis, supported by Ms Gite, one of my Assistant Heads with years of pastoral experience, and Ms Overare, our SENDCO.

Homework Update

We are reintroducing an enhanced homework programme to support pupils in developing independent learning skills and reinforcing key knowledge in their core subjects. A detailed letter regarding this will be shared next week, and we encourage all parents and carers to review it carefully with their child.

As part of this programme, we are introducing Homework Detentions for Years 7, 8, and 9 in core subjects (English, Maths, and Science). These detentions will take place for pupils who fail to complete or submit their homework on time. Our aim is to emphasise the importance of completing homework promptly and to provide additional support where needed.

We understand that adjustments to routines can be challenging, but we firmly believe this approach will help foster responsibility and improve academic outcomes. If you have any questions or concerns about this change, please do not hesitate to contact the school.

Challenge week

From 3rd February, our Year 11 and Year 13 pupils will be participating in Challenge Week, an important milestone in their academic journey. This week is designed to help pupils demonstrate their knowledge and skills, which are crucial for predicted grades and college applications. These grades play a significant role in shaping their onward pathways, whether that is university, apprenticeships, or other opportunities. We also want to remind Year 11 parents and carers that our Sixth Form Open Evening will take place on 15th January from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm. This event is an excellent opportunity to explore the options available in our Sixth Form and gain valuable insights to support your child's next steps. We strongly encourage all Year 11 families to attend.

Year 9 Options and parents evening

We are pleased to inform you that the Year 9 Parents' Evening will take place on 27th January 4.20-6.20pm. This is a key event in the school calendar, and we expect all Year 9 parents and carers to attend. Alongside the evening, we will be hosting an Year 9 Options Fair, giving pupils the opportunity to ask questions about the various subjects on offer and speak directly with teachers about the most suitable option choices for their future studies. This is an important step in helping your child make informed decisions about their GCSEs, and we look forward to seeing you there. I will also be leading two talks one at 4pm and 5pm to give further option information.

Thank you, as always, for your continued support. Together, we can ensure 2025 is a successful and memorable year for all our pupils.

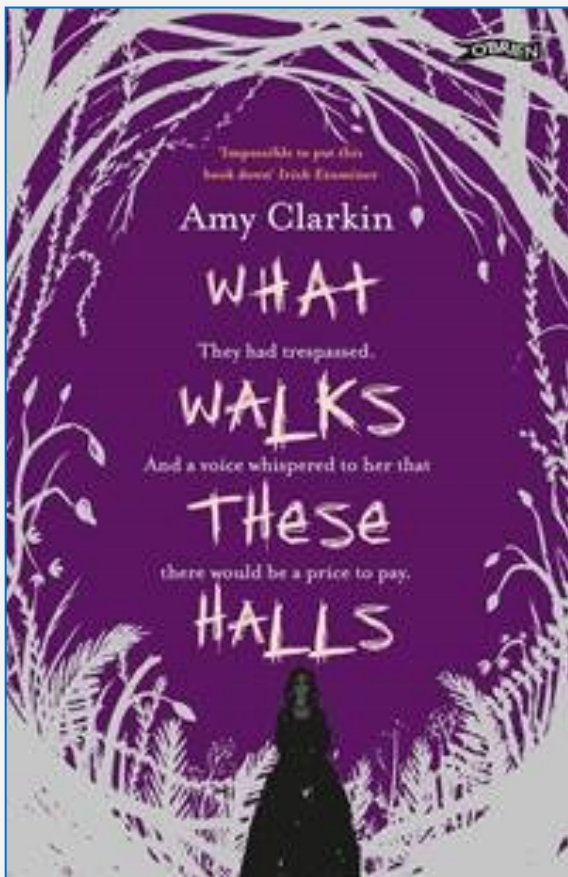

Dear Parents and Carers,

Outside behaviour at break & lunch

We hope you had a restful and joyful holiday season and are ready for the term ahead. As we return to school, we want to take this opportunity to share some important reminders and updates to support your child in their final full term of Year 11, as they are just 11 weeks away from their actual GCSE exams.

Challenge Week

A reminder that Challenge Week will be starting on **Monday, 3rd February**. This exam period is designed to help boost pupil outcomes, and we hope to see significant improvements as a result of their hard work and determination during this focused period. A reminder that all revision materials including the provisional timetable can be found on google sites/ google classroom. A subject 'how to support your child' guide was sent via Arbor to help parents support home revision.

Well Done to History Pupils

A huge well done to our History pupils for keeping up with their revision over the holidays and completing their assignments on Seneca. This dedication to their revision is commendable and sets a great example for others.

Punctuality

Punctuality remains a significant focus for us this term. With GCSE exams fast approaching, every lesson counts. Arriving on time is essential for your child's learning and helps set a positive tone for the day. We kindly ask for your continued support in ensuring your child arrives at school promptly each morning. Consistent lateness not only impacts your child's education but also disrupts the learning of others. Please can we make this a priority over the rest of this term.

Jewellery Policy

We have noticed an increasing number of pupils wearing excessive jewellery to school. Please remember that only minimal jewellery, as stated in our school uniform policy (one pair of earrings, a watch), is permitted. Excessive jewellery can pose a safety hazard. We appreciate your cooperation in ensuring that your child adheres to these rules.

Sanctions and Attendance

We would like to remind all pupils and parents about the importance of attending sanctions (e.g., break, lunch, or after-school restorations) when they are issued. These measures are in place to address behaviour concerns and ensure that lesson time is not disrupted. Attending sanctions promptly prevents the escalation of issues and supports a focused learning environment. With exams so close, maintaining a positive and disciplined approach is more important than ever.

Booster Sessions

Our booster sessions for extra intervention are continuing this term, and it is crucial that all pupils assigned to these sessions attend regularly. These sessions are specifically designed to support Year 11 pupils in preparing for their GCSEs and addressing and closing any gaps in knowledge. It was great to walk around and see the high engagement from pupils who are attending. Regular attendance can make a significant difference in their progress, so we strongly encourage your child's full participation.

Log in Issues

We are aware that there have been some technical issues regarding logging in for some pupils. We are working quickly to resolve these. If your child is experiencing these issues please contact sbragg@heathcote.waltham.sch.uk with your child's name, form and a preferred password. This needs to be a minimum of 7 characters and contain at least 1 number.

Envision Trip Reminder

A reminder that our pupils involved in the Envision Programme have a trip on *Thursday 16th January at the William Blair Office, 22 Bishopsgate, London EC2N 4BQ*.
