This important step allows us to tailor and create the most suitable option pathways for our pupils. 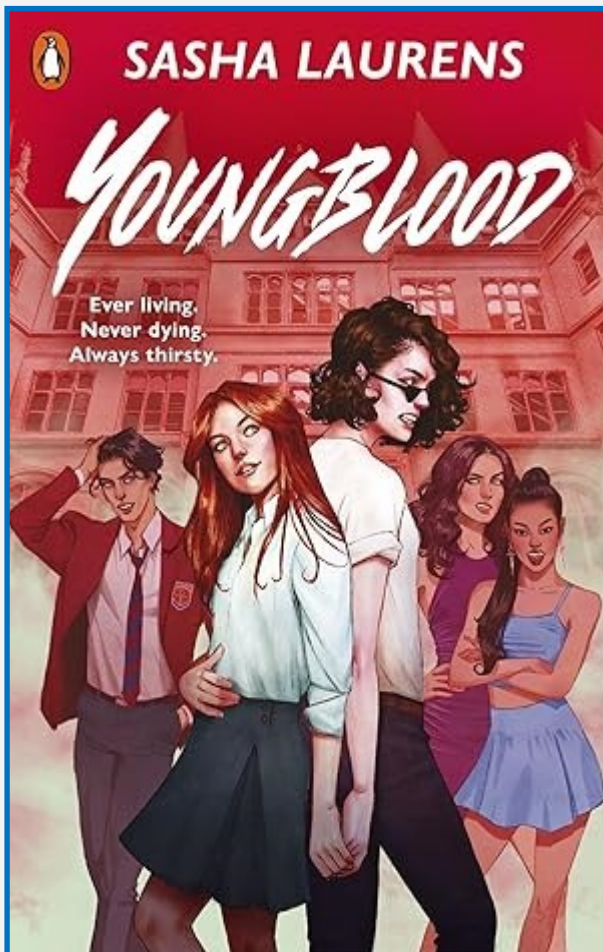

### Year 11 Challenge Week Success

Year 11 Challenge Week was a great success! Pupils approached their exams with a mature and focused attitude, demonstrating their dedication and readiness for the upcoming GCSEs. We are incredibly proud of their hard work and commitment. Results will be given to pupils in the next few weeks and it is important that they use this to tailor their revision to the areas where they need to improve.

### Exam Equipment Reminder

While the majority of pupils were well-prepared, we did notice that a small number were missing essential equipment during their maths exams. Please ensure that your child has the following items for their exams:

- Scientific calculator
- Protractor
- Ruler
- Rubber

These items will not be provided during the real exams. If your child needs any of these, we have 'exam ready' pencil cases available for purchase through Arbor.

### Attendance to exams

Attendance remains a significant priority for Year 11. We have noticed that some pupils believe they can 'catch up' on an exam if they miss it—this is not the case. If a pupil does not sit their scheduled GCSE exam, they will receive an ungraded mark, which will negatively impact their final results. Additionally, many subjects are still covering key exam content, making it vital for all pupils to attend every lesson.

### Uniform Expectations

A small number of pupils continue to have issues with uniform compliance. Please ensure that your child adheres to the school uniform policy, particularly regarding jewellery, shoes, and trousers. Maintaining uniform standards supports a focused and disciplined learning environment.

### Sixth Form Experience Day

This past week, some pupils had the opportunity to experience a day in the life of a Sixth Form student. Feedback has been overwhelmingly positive, and it has helped many pupils confirm their next steps after Year 11.

### After-School Boosters & Homework

After-school booster sessions and homework assignments have now resumed. Your child has an individual timetable available on Arbor. These boosters are designed to bridge knowledge gaps and help pupils achieve their target grades. We strongly encourage full attendance to maximise their success.

### *Dear Parents/Carers of Year 13,*

I hope February half term was a good break for pupils and gave them the opportunity to rest and recuperate. I know many pupils used this as an opportunity to recover from challenge week. Pupils expectedly have conducted themselves well during this process, which we hope has been a good learning opportunity. Staff feedback (which will commence in the coming weeks) will be invaluable for pupils, particularly in year 13, with department leads and I using this data and information to provide any further support required.

### **Attendance & Punctuality**

Well done to those pupils who are in the 100% club and resilience club. They have the privilege of an extended break time and will be invited to our upcoming pizza party as a reward. A polite reminder that you can check your child's attendance on the Arbor app and pupils should not be having unauthorised absence – this is the percentage as a parent/carer to keep an eye on. Please encourage your child to attend school every day. We will continue to communicate with you and provide support where possible to improve attendance in order for pupils to have the best life chances. Form tutors are also supported pupils each across this half term with their attendance and will also be making phone calls home to discover if there is anything further we can do to support.

### **Privileges**

Year 13 privileges were removed the week leading up to half term. I have been able to award 86 pupils back their privileges of a lunchtime off school site and an early finish if they have no taught lesson period 5. A handful of pupils have only been awarded a lunch time privilege, whilst a small number of pupils currently have no privileges. This will be reviewed fortnightly and pupils are being encouraged to improve their current attendance, punctuality &/or behaviour in order to receive privileges again. In addition, pupils have been informed that if they are late to school or receive a restoration for the next day, they will be unable to leave the school site for lunch the next day, so need to be organised with a packed lunch or have funds on their school account to purchase from the school canteen.

### **Achievement Assembly**

Their commitment to their studies has not gone unnoticed and consequently we had a mid-term achievement assembly on return for the half-term break. Well done to the vast amount of pupils who received a certificate and recognition from staff and for being ready, responsible and respectful young adults.

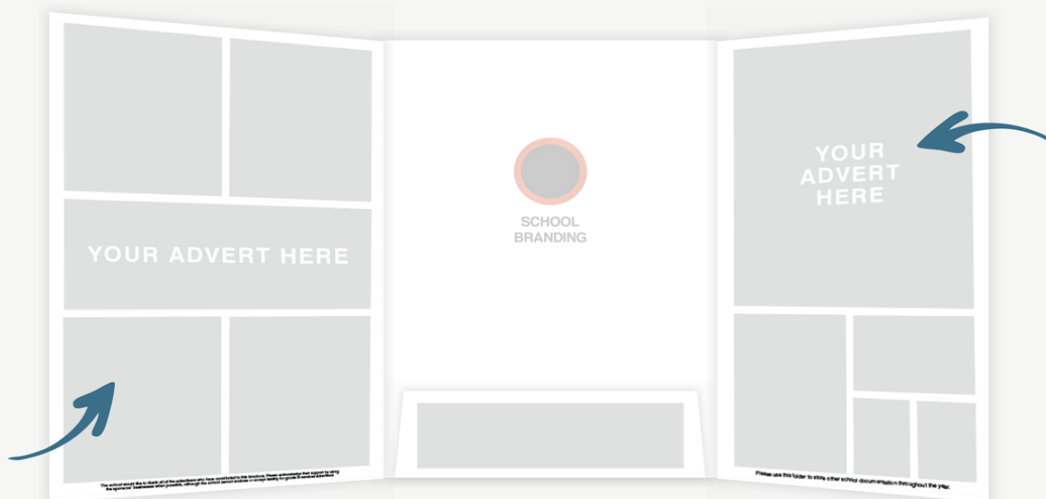
