Dear Parents/Carers,

A huge well done to our Sixth Form pupils for organising a wonderful Iftar event, which brought the Sixth Form community together in a truly special celebration. We are incredibly proud of the sense of unity and inclusion they have fostered.

Key Reminders:

Next week, we will be holding **road safety assemblies** for all year groups, as we have had a number of near misses where pupils have been carelessly crossing roads and not using the designated crossings. Please reinforce the importance of road safety with your child to help keep everyone safe.

It is disappointing to note that we have seen an increase in poor behaviour in some lessons, from some year groups, specifically pupils throwing objects in class. This seems to be linked to a recent trend, but it is simply not acceptable. As a result, I will be holding assemblies to reinforce our high expectations – our staff should not have to work in such conditions, and we expect all pupils to behave respectfully at all times and failing to do so will lead to consequences. Please ensure you talk to your child about this.

Finally, I would like to remind all parents and carers to **speak politely and respectfully** to the office staff when calling or visiting the school. We understand that concerns may arise, and we are always happy to help, but our staff deserve to be treated with courtesy. Running a school is challenging, and I do not want to lose valuable staff due to poor parental conduct. Of course, this message is only directed at a small minority, but it is important to address.

If you have any issues, please email the school and book a meeting with your child's Year Lead or a senior leader so that we can support you appropriately. Thank you for your ongoing support.

Our new librarian Ms Nash takes over Heathcote's Book Of The Fortnight

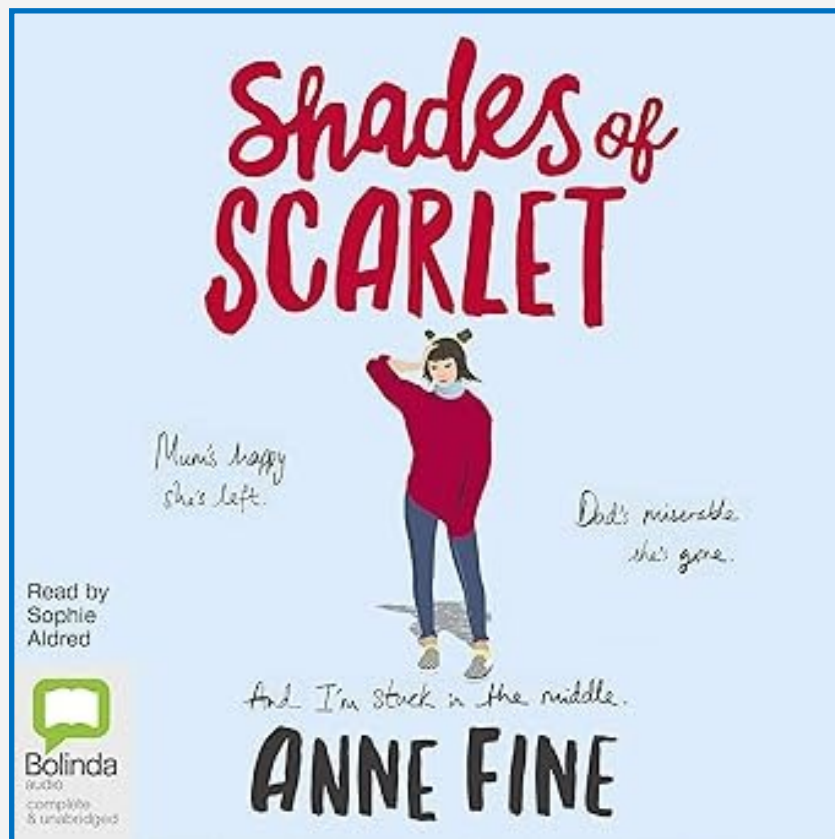
Shades of Scarlet

Dear Parents/Carers,

This week, our Year 8 pupils have started an exciting new reading initiative called "**Read to Lead**." This is a form group competition designed to encourage students to develop better reading habits, explore a wide range of books and resources, and engage in meaningful discussions.

Throughout the initiative, pupils will read independently and in small groups on various topics. They will also take part in activities that promote a love for reading. The competitive element will be based on a **points system**, where students can earn points by:

- Reading a challenging book
- Writing a book review
- Recommending a book to a peer (and their peer completing it)
- Actively contributing to form time discussions and activities
- Designing or creating resources for the competition, such as form display boards or leader-boards

The goal of this initiative is to encourage reading, develop essential literacy skills, and foster a positive attitude towards books. We look forward to seeing our pupils embrace this challenge and grow as confident readers!

Year 9 Options Booklets & Selection Forms

Next Friday, 4th April, all of our year 9 pupils will be given an options booklet to take home over the Easter break. This will also contain a selection form for them to indicate their 3 first choice option subjects as well as reserve choices. The booklet will have detailed information on all of the subjects offered to support you and your child with this process. Please do speak with your child about this over the break to ensure they are making fully considered choices.

Key Date: Year 9 Options Selection Evening

Options selection evening will take place on Thursday 1st May. On this evening all pupils & parents will be offered a one to one interview with a member of staff. They will collect your child's completed option form and talk through their choices with you. They will also be able to answer any final questions you may have and make any last adjustments to their selections.

Behaviour Reminder

I have this week been dealing with a few behaviour incidents caused by pupils congregating in the corridors and refusing to follow staff instructions to move on or go into their classroom. This behaviour is not acceptable and will be sanctioned. Pupils are encouraged to move briskly between lessons, and, on arriving in the subject area to go straight into the room. Excuses such as 'the room was a bit empty, so I didn't want to go in', 'my friend wasn't there yet so I went to find them' or 'there was a crowd so I went to see what was going on' are not acceptable.

Subject recognition

I just wanted to take a moment to praise the Year 10 Art students. They have been incredibly focused in their lessons and are producing some really high-quality artwork. Their dedication and effort have been great to see and this has primarily been identified by Ms Dale.

Ms Dale has highlighted how they are a pleasure to teach. Well done to all of them.

Uniform

Over the last two weeks, there has been a massive improvement with uniform and overall presentation. This remains an area that we will continually address.

Pupils are regularly checked upon entrance to the school and are always challenged on uniform. As a kind reminder, if pupils report to school with missing items they are likely to be sent home to collect what they have left. Please note that this can cause disruption to their learning so it is important that they are challenged to prepare for school in advance.

Please also note that Acrylic nails are not to be worn in school.

Behaviour

Over the last few weeks there have been some growing concerns related to conduct in the classroom. Year 10 as a cohort have recently been spoken to regarding this. Concerns are related to the throwing of items across the classroom alongside noises being made in the attempt to disrupt. We are working hard to identify the main culprits.

Please can I ask that you discuss this with your child to avoid any further action which can result in you child completely being removed from the lesson. Our aim is to ensure learning takes place in an environment that is calm and engaging.

Dear Parents/Carers,

Thank you for attending our Year 11 Parents Evening on Thursday. We hope you found the evening informative and that you now have a clear understanding of how your child can make the most of these final weeks before exams begin. Please note if you were unable to purchase revision guides, pencil cases or calculators on the evening, these will still be available on Arbor.

This week saw the launch of our new form time intervention, I am pleased to say that so far this seems to be working well and pupils are engaging in the different sessions on offer for them. After school booster attendance seems to have dropped in some subjects, we really need everyone on board in the last few weeks and making the most of the opportunities on offer to them.

As we approach the Easter holidays, it is vital that pupils use this time to reflect on subjects where they may be underperforming and focus their revision on these areas. From our data analysis, we can see that a significant number of pupils are close to the next grade boundary in some subjects, meaning that a final push in revision could make a real difference to their outcomes and get on to their chosen courses post-16. Effective revision should include completing past paper questions so they can understand the command words and subject terminology in exam papers. Pupils should not just be watching YouTube videos and making revision cards.

You would have received a letter from Ms. Gite this week outlining key information about the exam and booster offer at school for Year 11s.
