Dear Parents/Carers,

Mock Exams / Challenge week

Mock exam will start the week beginning 16th June. We will be conducting these mocks within our school sports hall in line with the JCQ guidelines. It is important that we start to prepare year 10's to ensure they understand how exams are to be conducted.

Whilst this may be stressful and new for most, it is important that we start this now to ensure they are best prepared for their GCSE exams. This time next year, year 10s will be partly through the GCSE exam window. Please discuss this with your child in advance to ensure they are best prepared for official exam conditions.

Work Experience

We are extremely pleased that the vast majority of students have secured a work placement for the week **beginning 30th June**. For those that have yet to select their choices, they should have by now selected and ranked their preferences on the BEP website www.bepgroup.net. All pupils have received their pins and login details.

Across the week, a Heathcote staff member may visit the placement to assess how your child is getting on. It is therefore important your child understands the importance and value of this. We are confident that all will conduct themselves in line with the Heathcote School values.

Summer Reward Trip

We are currently exploring our summer reward trip to Rowan's Bowling Alley. Shortly, we will be sending out the finer details along with a payment option. This will likely be an upfront payment. Work Experience reminders

Just a reminder for any pupils who have not already secured their work experience placements/have not chosen their options via the BEP portal. The BEP portal is live and the pupils must make their choices as soon as possible as there are limited spaces available for the placements. All pupils have been given a pin to access this system. 1. Pupils need to ensure they make between 4-6 choices as this is more likely to secure a placement they are interested in.
2. Please remember, first choices are not guaranteed.
3. When making a selection, please consider the distance and ensure it is realistic in terms of travel time and cost.
4. Once students have selected, BEP will start confirming. This means that students who leave this process to the last minute are likely to be left with the least popular choices.

Year 13 students minding the Knowledge Gap

2025 saw the launch of our seminal programme of collaboration with King's College London.

The programme, aptly coined 'Bridging the Gap' was a collaborative project with undergraduates from Kings' College London (KCI) to work with 6 of our best Year 13 students in a project whose main objective is to reduce the knowledge and practical skills gap between AQA 'A' level work and what lab work is carried out in higher education and in a Russell Group cutting edge research environment.

The project was spread out over 3 months and involved weekly visits from Kings undergraduates co-creating material that maps the complexity of different experimental techniques.

Topics that were possible to investigate included:

- advancing simple light microscopy to advanced imaging of real-time processes;
- how diseases are modelled and new medicines tested using cell/tissue and animal systems (could show e.g. radio-telemetry monitoring of conscious free moving animals);
- the interplay between biology and engineering – AI and data science methods in advanced cardiac imaging to support patient management and care

Heathcote students chose to investigate current techniques and models for the development of new medicines using an array of techniques from in-vitro and in-vivo techniques to AI modelling of drug development

The project was an exciting adventure for our students who learnt state of the art biomedical techniques, how to collaborate with undergraduates from Kings, a day visit to Kings College and state of the art laboratories, as well as give a number of presentations of their final product to a 'Dragon Den' presentation to university professors.

Both Year 13 students from Heathcote and undergraduates from KCI celebrated their collaborative project to close the knowledge gap between A-level content and university expectations with a final presentation of their product at Heathcote School.

Heathcote School's U13 Girls' Football Team made history this week as they reached their first-ever London Cup final, held at the impressive Bedfont Stadium in West London. Facing a strong Richmond School side, the girls showed tremendous character and determination in what was a fiercely contested match.

Despite trailing 2-0 at half time, the Heathcote team battled valiantly throughout the second half, refusing to let their heads drop and continuing to press forward in search of a comeback. Although the final whistle confirmed a loss, the team walked away with heads held high, proud of their incredible journey to such a prestigious stage.

Georgie led the line with tireless energy and relentless work rate, troubling the Richmond defence throughout. Meanwhile, Mia put in a standout performance on the wing, combining creativity going forward with vital defensive contributions.

Every player gave their all and represented Heathcote with pride. This historic cup run marks a significant achievement for the team and a sign of even greater things to come for girls' football at the school.
